Some definitions of **communities of practice** on the internet:

(COPs) - a self-organized, deliberate collaboration of people who share common practices, interests or aims and want to advance their knowledge. When the community proves useful to its members over time, they may formalize their status by adopting a group name and a regular system of interchange. Formal or informal groups of people who share common work interests, such as a profession or work project. In the context of knowledge management systems, these communities usually interact online rather than in person. www.vnulearning.com/kmwp/glossary.html
